THE ENGBERG-FEWSTER INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT

TERMS OF REFERENCE:

A maximum amount of \$3,000 will be disbursed during any one fiscal year. More than one grant of lesser value may be awarded.

Applications of no more than 4 pages must include a summary of the project, and a full description of the planned activities and information about international partners.

The Canadian partner must be responsible for the accounting of the funds awarded, and it is recommended that the funds be kept in Canada until required, whenever possible.

The Fund will not support travel of Canadians to international conferences, or assist Canadian home economists in participating in the activities of the International Federation for Home Economics [IFHE].

Criteria:

1. Proposals for funds may be requested for the following purposes:
 - a) To conduct evaluation of projects (for example, CIDA¹ and/or NGO² projects) which have been completed and where there is a potential for future cooperation with international partners.
 - b) To match CIDA/NGO/other partnership program funding to allow a proposed project between international partners to proceed. In the case that a project is able to be completed with the limited funds available from this award, non-matching funding may be considered.
 - c) To allow a home economist from a developing country, who is involved in a Canadian partnership project, to travel to Canada to work with a group of home economists to further their partnership. Only airfare will be subsidized; billeting costs will be the responsibility of the Canadian group.
2. At least one member of the project group must be a Canadian home economist, family studies teacher, dietitian, nutritionist, or other professional in a home economics related field³.

Application:

Deadline for applications (using the form provided) is **March 21**. The committee will consider requests for application extensions.

Procedures:

Submit the completed application electronically as an e-mail attachment in WORD, RTF or PDF to CHE Foundation Trustee Nancy Schneider, PHEc: nancy_schneider@umanitoba.ca

Applications will be reviewed by a committee of the CHE Foundation executive. The Executive may request advice from home economists or others experienced in international development in evaluating the proposal.

Post-project:

A report and copies of original receipts will be due at the completion of the project; any unused funds must be returned to the Fund.

About the Fund:

The International Development Fund was initiated by Dr. Lila Engberg and Dr. Jean Fewster, Ontario home economists with extensive experience working in developing countries, and members of the International Development Committee of the Canadian Home Economics Association (which dissolved December 2003). The Fund, established July 1995, is administered by the Canadian Home Economics Foundation (CHEF). The first grant was awarded in May 2006.
