

ANNUAL REPORT 2008 – 2009

HIGHLIGHTS

The Executive Committee of the Foundation held seven (7) meetings during 2008-09, as well as the Board of Trustees Annual Meeting and the Foundation's 28th Annual Meeting and Donor Recognition during the joint Manitoba Home Economics Association Conference held in October 2008 in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Funding was approved for 19 grants and awards in areas of research, education, public service, and post-secondary education and training to a total level of \$27,313 for the 2008 - 2009 fiscal year. The revised version of the CHE Foundation website project was launched in the fall of 2008. Canadian Home Economics Journal issues from 1975 to 2003 have been posted on the website to provide access to researchers in home economics / human ecology and related disciplines.

Foundation information was provided to meetings of the Canadian Association for Research in Home Economics, the Association of Canadian Human Ecology Students, several university alumni reunions and home economics and home economics / family studies teachers associations.

Eleanor Menzies, Isabel Palmeter and Kathy Weisbrod have agreed to serve on the Board of Trustee for another three year term. Provincial trustees have chaired Award committees and distributed information about the Foundation to local meetings and conferences.

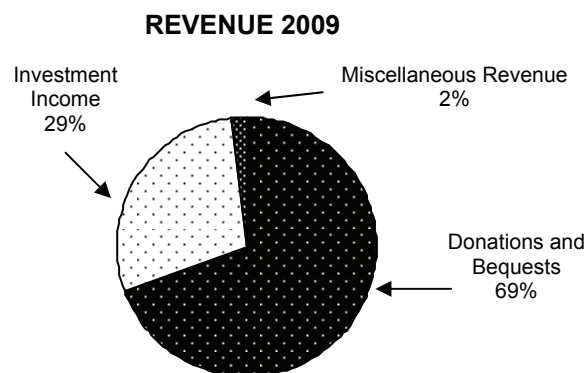

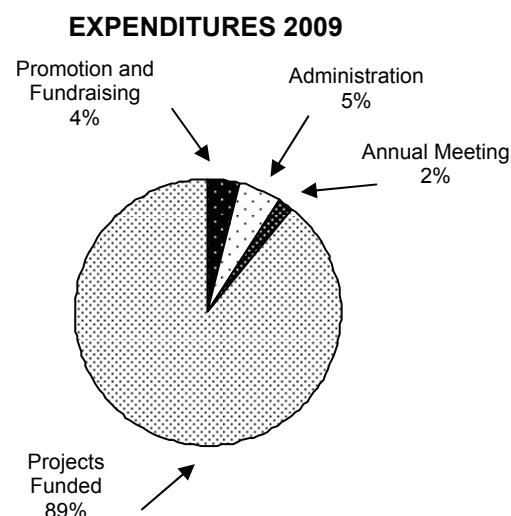
